

Dear Friends of WEDU,

The past year in particular has been one filled with exciting up's and difficult down's for WEDU. We began FY2018 by becoming West Central Florida's sole PBS station. And, WEDU became one of the first PBS stations in the country to offer six broadcast channels when we added two new channels!

This exciting change for WEDU could not have been accomplished without many long hours and dedicated work from WEDU's board and staff. Of course the most dedicated to this hurculean effort was Susan Howarth, WEDU's President & CEO. Sadly, Susan passed away in September after fighting a coura-

geous battle with cancer. Susan and WEDU's Board of Directors entrusted me with the honor of serving as WEDU's Interim President & CEO while a national search was conducted. Susan requested that no memorial be held on her behalf. But, we honor her more than four decades of service to public broadcasting by carrying on with the committment to quality programming that she had championed throughout her career. And it is in Susan's honor, we carry on....

With the addition of WEDU's new channels and as we celebrate WEDU's 60th Anniversary year which began on October 27, 2018, on-air programming continues to be the foundation in providing mission driven content that informs, inspires, entertains and enhances the lives of West Central Florida's citizens.

WEDU PBS brings the best in science, education, music, dance, drama, and public affairs to the more than five million people we serve. Our engaging local programs include FLORIDA THIS WEEK, SUNCOAST BUSINESS FORUM, UP CLOSE WITH CATHY UNRUH, WEDU ARTS PLUS, WEDU QUEST, and THAT'S ALL I'M SAYING WITH ERNEST HOOPER. We produce these local programs because we are passionate about the communities of West Central Florida and believe you are too! If you missed any of the episodes, I invite you to watch them online at wedu.org.

WEDU PBS offers multiple ways to connect with us by bringing these programs to life in the community through outreach events and online services. Florida PBS LearningMedia serves 100,000 teachers and 540,000 students across the state, an online resource with more than 125,000 PBS educational videos, games, and lesson plans for use in the classroom at no charge to educators. Each month, 100 new resources are added to Florida PBS LearningMedia. Of special note, Florida has the 4th highest usage rate of the service in the country. WEDU enhances our community outreach with special town halls, documentaries, and roundtable discussions on topics of community importance such as autism, veterans' issues, the opioid crisis and more.

WEDU PBS continues strong partnerships with organizations such as Gulf Coast Community Foundation, Pinellas Community Foundation, The Community Foundation of Sarasota, and The Community Foundation of Tampa Bay. On Give Day 2018, in partnership with The Community Foundation of Tampa Bay, more than \$1.7 million was raised for local charities when WEDU served as the Media Headquarters, producing a live 8-hour broadcast of the event.

All of these services and content are made possible by viewer donations, corporate support, and the continued investment of state and federal dollars. We are honored that you put your trust in the one place that can take you any place.

Attaining a 4-star rating verifies that Florida West Coast Public Broadcasting exceeds industry standards and outperforms most charities in their area of work.

Only 17% of the charities evaluated have received at least 4 consecutive 4-star evaluations, indicating that Florida West Coast Public Broadcasting outperforms most other charities in America. This exceptional designation from Charity Navigator sets Florida West Coast Public Broadcasting apart from its peers and demonstrates to the public its trustworthiness.



Susan Howarth, WEDU President and CEO, dies at 66following battle with cancer

Susan Howarth, longtime public media leader and WEDU PBS President and CEO, died on September 5 following a courageous battle with cancer. She was 66. Howarth was named WEDU President and CEO in April 2010 and was the fifth president and chief executive officer of WEDU.

Over her 8-year tenure, Howarth led the organization through a period of growth that included an expanded roster of local on-air programming, including original documentaries such as the Emmy[®] Award winning Too Close To Home - Human Trafficking in Tampa Bay. WEDU also added three new local series including WEDU ARTS PLUS, WEDU QUEST, and THAT'S ALL I'M SAYING WITH ERNEST HOOPER.

Under Howarth's tenure the station also significantly expanded its community outreach efforts offering a robust collection of community film screenings and panel discussion events that have tackled topics ranging from youth homelessness and veterans' issues to race relations and more. WEDU's educational outreach efforts were also expanded with the addition of free teacher workshops utilizing Florida PBS Learning Media and PBS resources, kids' events providing free educational resources to families and educators, and the donation of multimedia PBS resources to local libraries.

Like her many colleagues throughout the public broadcasting community, Howarth was passionate about sharing the story of public broadcasting and its value and commitment to serving communities. This was never more important than in 2011 when funding for public broadcasting stations in Florida was eliminated from the state budget. Howarth was instrumental in collaborating with each of the public television stations and public radio stations in Florida to make a case for the impact that public broadcasting provides the communities they serve in educational resources and lifelong learning. Funding for the Florida stations was restored the following fiscal year.

Howarth ushered WEDU through its most recent addition of two new channels, making WEDU one of the first public broadcasting stations in the nation to have six channels of programming in its coverage area. In October 2017, the expanded service included 24/7 programming dedicated to PBS Kids and Create® TV. Making use of new technology, WEDU added essentially all of WUSF-TV's programming when the area's secondary PBS station ceased broadcasting in October 2017 and WEDU became the only PBS station serving West Central Florida.

Howarth was a 43-year veteran of public broadcasting. In honoring her wishes and dedication to public broadcasting, memorial donations can be made to the Susan Howarth Memorial Fund WEDU PBS at 1300 N Boulevard, Tampa, Fl. 33607.

WEDU PBS **Significantly Expands Programming** for Viewers in West Central Florida

WEDU became one of the first PBS stations in the country to have six channels of programming in its coverage area on Monday, Oct. 16. The expanded service includes two new channels with 24/7 programming on dedicated topics: PBS KIDS and Create® TV, which features inspiring how-to shows.

WEDU PBS also added a host of popular shows like DOC MARTIN, FATHER BROWN, PENELOPE KEITH'S HIDDEN VILLAGES, MIDSOMER MURDERS, THE CORONER and A PLACE TO CALL HOME to WEDU's existing channels. Essentially all of the PBS programming that was previously seen on WUSF-TV, which ceased its programming on Oct. 15, can now be found on WEDU's channels.

"WEDU is excited to serve the community with even more programming that will educate, inform and enrich our viewers' lives," said Susan Howarth, president and CEO of WEDU PBS. "With these changes, our viewers will see the same quality programming they've come to know from WEDU PBS over the past 60 years, along with even more educational and entertaining programs for every age and interest."

With the addition of PBS KIDS, WEDU also broadcasts PBS KIDS shows 24 hours a day and offers a live stream, making it easy for children to watch their favorite series during primetime and other after-school hours when viewing among families is high. Viewers also have access to additional educational resources that will soon be available for teachers and parents as a companion to the programming on the channel. PBS KIDS features popular, educational programs like "Sesame Street," "Arthur," and "Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood."

More often called "do-it-yourself," the program genres seen on Create® TV include viewers' favorite public television series and specials on cooking, travel, home improvement, gardening, arts and crafts, and other lifestyle interests. Programs include "Cook's Country," "Garden Smart," "Wyland's Art Studio," and "This Old House."

Now with six channels, WEDU leveraged PBS national programs encouraging viewers to explore new ideas and broaden personal hori-

couraging viewers to explore new ideas and broaden personal horizons with content that showcased education, arts, culture, science, nature, news and public affairs locally and around the world.

There was no shortage of quality drama on WEDU with programs like CALL THE MIDWIFE, POLDARK, ANNE OF GREEN GABLES and THE MINIATURIST. In January, VICTORIA returned and viewers were able to follow Victoria's dramatic story, from the time she became queen in 1837 at age 18.

GREAT PERFORMANCES gave viewers a front row seat to amazing performances of AN AMERICAN IN PARIS THE MUSICAL, RODGERS & HAMMERSTEIN'S THE SOUND OF MUSIC, JOHN LEGUIZAMO'S ROAD TO BROADWAY, and HAL PRINCE: A DIRECTOR'S JOURNEY.

The summer of 2018 was full of great programs to explore as part of the Summer of Adventure. Programs such as NO PASSPORT REQUIRED, KINGDOMS OF THE SKY, and WONDERS OF MEXICO ensured that there was plenty to explore on WEDU during the hot summer months.

New series AMANPOUR & COMPANY launched in September and examined the global issues, domestic news and trends impacting the world. FRONTLINE THE FACEBOOK DILEMMA asked the question "Is Facebook more harmful than helpful" during the yearlong investigation that went inside the truth and consequences of Facebook's global rise to power.

We discovered how one institution has met the changing demands of healthcare for 150 years and what that can teach us about facing the modern challenges of patient care in THE MAYO CLINIC: FAITH - HOPE - SCIENCE.

WEDU PBS Educational Programming & Services

WEDU continued an unwavering commitment to provide quality educational programming for our youngest citizens and prepare children for school. Each week, WEDU provided more than 76 hours of educational programs that inspired children to explore the world around them.

WEDU presented nearly 25 workshops and conference sessions, serving more than 475 educators, families, early learning providers, media-specialists and pre-service teachers enrolled in area colleges.

State-wide conference presentations included the Florida After School Association (FASA) conference and the Florida Association for the Education of Young Children (FLAEYC) conference.

Approximately 20 family engagement events provided educational experiences and valuable take-home materials to more than 35,000 children and families.

Three of our most successful programs, Free Tuesdays, Storybook Forest and PBS Kids Fun Zone at the Florida State Fair are highlighted below.

The WEDU PBS Kids Fun Zone, created through a partnership with the Florida State Fair Authority, featured appearances by more than 15 PBS Kids characters, fun crafts, and a variety of educational take home resources for families. The event was open daily throughout the run of the fair, February 8-19. In addition to character appearances, visitors were invited to "test drive" PBS Kids apps at WEDU's Mobile Learning Lab, dance along to music videos streamed through the new PBS Kids PLUG & PLAY and just generally have lots of fun! Thousands of children and families were served during the event and feedback from attendees was very positive.

WEDU PBS Kids Fun Zone

WEDU hosted the WEDU PBS Kids Fun Zone at the Florida State Fair. The event featured appearances by more than 15 PBS Kids characters, fun crafts, and a variety of educational take home resources for families. The event was open from 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. daily throughout the run of the fair from February 8 - 19.

In addition to character appearances, visitors were invited to "test-drive" PBS Kids apps at WEDU's Mobile Learning Lab, dance along to music videos streamed through the new PBS Kids Plug & Play. Thousands of children and families were served during the event to explore everything WEDU PBS has to offer and to have lots of fun!

WEDU PBS Library Corners

In November 2015, WEDU received a very generous bequest from a long-time viewer. The \$4 million gift was the largest gift ever to WEDU. WEDU placed Mrs. Ensign's gift into WEDU's Endowment, which is providing long-term support for WEDU's operating budget. WEDU continued to donate library corners this year.

The library corners include a bookshelf with a robust collection of PBS Kids books, DVDs, CDs for the library's lending collection, a reading rug, 2 electronic tablets loaded with PBS apps, 6 turnkey activity sessions with educational materials, a family resource guide, activity sheets, bookmarks, pencils, and more. WEDU also provides the library staffs from each location a free training session on Florida PBS LearningMedia, PBS Read-Aloud Program, and PBS Kids Lab.

WEDU PBS Phyllis L. Ensign Library Corners are now open at libararies in Lake Wales, Safety Harbor, North Port, Sarasota, Mulberry, Bradenton and Tampa. WEDU plans to open a minimum of 20 library corners.





WEDU PBS Community Outreach

Throughout the year, WEDU provided a wide variety of outreach activities in West Central Florida, including children's events with character appearances and educational activities, community screenings with engaging discussion, town hall meetings that addressed community needs, historical film screenings and lectures, and much more.

WEDU brought PBS programming to life through community outreach events. This year, WEDU hosted a series of events with Julia Colin Davison and Bridget Lancaster, the hosts of AMERICA'S TEST KITCHEN. As part of the launch for the new season, WEDU hosted a community event in Sarasota and a donor luncheon with cooking demonstrations and tastings. Guests learned about kitchen skills and food safety tips and heard behind the scenes stories from the show.

WEDU participated in the Be My Neighbor Block Party hosted by the Tampa Theatre ahead of a screening of the documentary "Won't You Be My Neighbor."

WEDU hosted two community preview events for the premiere of LITTLE WOMEN. On April 19, we were joined by approximately 400 guests at Polk Theatre in Lakeland. On April 26, we hosted approximately 350 guests at Tampa Theatre in Tampa.

Approximately 60 guests joined WEDU for American Stage in the Park at Demen's Landing in St. Petersburg. The annual event was held on a beautiful spring evening and included food and entertainment from American Stage Theatre.


WEDU PBS Lifelong Learning

WEDU Hosts Give Day Tampa Bay

Honoring WEDU's mission to help raise awareness for local nonprofits, WEDU served as the Headquarters and Media Hub for Give Day Tampa Bay - a 24-hour community wide effort to raise funds for local charities in partnership with the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay. 


